We encourage you to read and think about problems and solutions within this topic, diving into how youth can be motivated in taking part in political life. Preparational work questions are provided, to help you through your reading. Please note that the material provided comes from multiple sources, including NGOs, IGOs and mainstream news agencies. Be aware that different sources may set up different portrayals of the topic.
